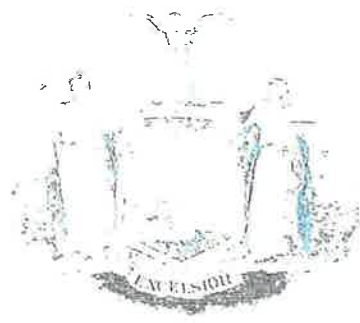

Absolute Charter

Boricua College

This Instrument Witnesseth That the Board of Regents for and on behalf of the New York State Education Department has granted this absolute charter to Boricua College, located in the city, county, and state of New York, which was incorporated by the Board of Regents under a provisional charter on June 27, 1975 to offer curricula leading to the degrees of associates in arts (A.A.), associate in science (A.S.), and associate in applied science (A.A.S.), such provisional charter having been amended on June 24, 1977 with respect to the location of the corporation and on March 2, 1979, authorizing the corporation to offer curricula leading to the degrees of bachelor of arts (B.A.) and bachelor of science (B.S.) in conformity with the Rules of the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York and the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education, and has continued the said corporation with all its powers, privileges and duties; and the authority of the college to conduct courses of study leading to the degrees of bachelor of arts (B.A.) and bachelor of science (B.S.) is continued until June 30, 1986. Such authority may be extended beyond June 30, 1986 or granted permanently upon further application to the Regents. Until such authority is granted on a permanent basis, bachelor of arts (B.A.) and bachelor of science (B.S.) degrees will be conferred by The University of the State of New York upon graduates of Boricua College who, in the judgment of the Regents, shall have duly earned the same.
